Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

1. Current course number, title, and catalog description:

EDSP377 Educational Tests and Measurements 3c-01-3sh Prerequisites: PC 101, admission to junior standing in teacher certification or permission.

Designed to acquaint students with major methods and techniques of evaluation used to assess and report growth, development, and academic achievement of individuals in an educational environment. Includes interpretation of standardized test information.

2. Proposed course number, title, and catalog description:

EDSP 477 Assessment of Student Learning: Design & Interpretation of Educational Measures 3cr-01-3sh
Prerequisites: PC 101, admission to junior standing in teacher certification or permission

Designed to acquaint students with major methods and techniques of evaluation used to assess and report growth, development, and academic achievement of individuals in an educational environment. Includes interpretation of standardized test information.

3. Justification/Rationale:

We request a course number change because we plan to submit a request to the Graduate Committee to make the course a dual level course. The Teacher Education Coordinating Council has asked our department to create a dual level section of the course for post-baccalaureate students returning for teacher certification. The Graduate Committee requests all new dual level courses be at the 400 level. Because the course is take by juniors now and is considered to be a challenging course the renumbering seems appropriate.

A change in course title is requested to better reflect the catalog description's emphasis on assessment as opposed to "tests".

I fully approve and support your department's proposed plan to delete EP 618 Interpretation of Tests, which Post-Baccalaureate students are currently are required to take to satisfy their Educational Tests and Measurements requirement.
