The development of Irish writing is examined within the contexts of Irish history, language, culture, and politics.

ENGL 387 Irish Literature

Prerequisites: ENGL 202, 210, 211, 212, 213

An introduction to Irish literature since 1800, with particular emphasis on the Literary Revival in the early twentieth century. Key authors include Yeats, Joyce, Synge, O'Casey, Edgeworth, Somerville and Ross, Gregory, Beckett, and Heaney. The development of Irish writing is examined within the contexts of Irish history, language, culture, and politics.

Justification/Rationale for Change:

Since this is the only course currently offered at IUP in Irish studies, students from a variety of majors are interested in taking it, but the five prerequisites make that impossible for non-majors. Since the course focuses mostly on twentieth-century Irish literature, English majors who have taken ENGL 213: British and American Literature Since 1900 will benefit most by being able to contextualize this nation's literature in relation to trends and movements in twentieth-century literature. However, the instructor wants the opportunity to grant permission to those with other majors (i.e. English Education) who demonstrate the background and ability to do advanced work in literature.
