EN 318: ADOLESCENT LITERATURE

3 Credits

Prerequisite:

Admission to Certification Program in English Education

This course offers prospective secondary English teachers a survey of the literature adolescents choose to read, enjoy, and find relevant to their lives. Includes literature that offers psychological and sociological perspectives on adolescence.

Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

2. Summary of proposed revisions:

EN 218: Literature of Adolescence is being changed to EN 318: Adolescent Literature. The general description, prerequisites, goals, and objectives remain the same.

3. Justification/Rationale for the Proposed change.

When the English Department's B.S. in Education degree program was revised recently, it was recommended that EN 218: Literature of Adolescence be taken in the fall of the junior year. Changing the course number from EN 218 to EN 318 was overlooked at that time. A 300-level number is more appropriate for the course. The title change keeps the title within the required 20 character limit.
