The Dietetic Internship is an accredited supervised practice program for 12 eligible students that are selected in April from applicants that apply in February of each year. Eligible students must have a Bachelor's degree, a verification statement from an accredited undergraduate Dietetics Program, and be accepted to the IUP School of Graduate Studies and Research. Applications for the dietetic internship must use the computerized application administered by the Dietetic Internship Centralized Application Services (https://portal.dicas.org/) and participate in computer matching (administered by D & D Digital, https://www.dnddigital.com/).

The dietetic internship program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education of Nutrition and Dietetics of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics and meets the required competencies required to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist. Students who complete the dietetic internship are eligible to take the national examination to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist. Students that complete the dietetic internship track may choose to complete the IUP Master of Science in Food and Nutrition.
