As of now, I do not foresee offering SPAN 122, 132 or 211 at any point in the future. 244 is a part of the Cuernavaca program which is on long-term hiatus, given the situation in Mexico now.

I don't foresee us offering Italian again.

I don't see us offering 203 again, but I don't think I want it deleted yet. Not sure of the disposition of FRNC 301, but if it is offered--unlikely at the moment--I don't expect it to have LS designation.

Sean, I'm following up from emails that I sent you this summer about Foreign Language Liberal Studies offerings and also have a new question for you. Thank you for your help. David

New request - the registrar's office sent us a question about FRNC 203 (also in an earlier email below) and FRNC 202 that I can't seem to find an answer to. The question is do you want FRNC 203 and FRNC 202 to still be LS Elective courses? It appears that they have not been revised and by default they will not be kept as LS Elective courses after this semester. If you could please let me know what the plans are for this course I'd be most appreciative.

Summary of earlier emails:

1. The Liberal Studies (LS) office did not receive course revision proposals for SPAN 122 Spanish for Health Care Professionals II, SPAN 132 Spanish for the Hospitality Industry II, SPAN 211 Intermediate Spanish, SPAN 244

Modern Mexico as LS Electives or LS Elective/Global and Multicultural Awareness (GMA) courses in the specified time period for implementation of the new LS curriculum.. Beginning in spring semester 2015 these courses, if offered, will no longer be able to be taken for Liberal Studies Elective credit. You always have the option of submitting a course revision proposal at any time and if approved regaining LS Elective status for these courses.

2. The Liberal Studies (LS) office did not receive course revision proposals for ITAL 201 & 202 Intermediate Italian III & IV as Liberal Studies Elective courses in the specified time period for implementation of the new LS curriculum.
