Part II. Proposal to delete from the catalog the concentration known as Spanish for Elementary Education, and to omit its accompanying reference to the program known as FLISET (Foreign Languages and International Studies for Elementary Teaching)

The following text, which is PROPOSED FOR DELETION is found in the 2005-06 Undergraduate Catalog under the Department of Spanish (page 118 in the hard copy).

Spanish for Elementary Education

A student in Elementary Education may elect a concentration of 19 credits of Spanish, consisting of the following:

SPAN 201	Intermediate Spanish or equivalent	4cr
SPAN 220	Intermediate Spanish Conversation and Grammar	3cr
SPAN 230	Intermediate Spanish Composition	3cr
SPAN 260	Introduction to Hispanic Literature	3cr
SPAN 350	Advanced Spanish Conversation	3cr
SPAN 404	Advanced Spanish Grammar	3cr

Elementary Education students wishing to prepare to teach in elementary programs where content teaching in Spanish is the objective should enroll in the Foreign Languages and International Studies for Elementary Teaching (FLISET) program described under the Department of Professional Studies in Education.

The rationale for the change is that the Department of Spanish is now proposing a minor in Spanish for Elementary Teaching that would take the place of both the concentration and the current academic specialty known as FLISET. This concentration and FLISET will be rendered obsolete by the new minor.

This proposal is to take the place of one that was approved by the College of Humanities and Social Sciences in May 2006, and is currently tabled with the UWUCC. (The Department of Professional Studies in Education has written a letter in support of the proposed new minor. That letter accompanied the proposal for the minor in Spanish for Elementary Teaching, which was approved by the CHSS and is currently under review by TECC and by the UWUCC.)

The Department of Spanish has asked the Department of Professional Studies in Education to begin the procedure for the section on FLISET to be omitted from the Professional Studies section of the catalog. The Department of Spanish will also ask that Professional Studies include in its part of the catalog a reference to the minor in Spanish for Elementary Teaching. Once that proposal has been approved by the College of Education and Educational Technology, all three proposals can be considered by the UWUCC.

Part III. Implementation.

The deletion of the concentration will not affect any students, as no students have enrolled in the concentration in recent memory. Students in the current FLISET specialty will be given the option to either complete the specialty or to complete the new minor in Spanish for Elementary Teaching.
