I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Sp 340 Hispanic Civilization Through the 19th Century

3 credits 3 lecture hours (3c-01-3sh) Required for all majors and minors

This course is an introduction to the significant aspects of the culture of both Spain and Spanish America. Elements for explanation and discussion are drawn from artistic, literary, religious, geographic, social and political manifestations of Hispanic culture as these have revealed themselves through the 19th century. Taught in Spanish. Required for all majors and minors.

II. COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Students will know the origins of the Spanish language and Hispanic civilization.
- Students will know the principal features which characterize each cultural period of Spain and the New World through the 19th century.
- 3. Students will demonstrate an understanding of the major social, political, and religious forces which have shaped the culture of Hispanic people through the 19th century.

Research paper. Each student will prepare a 3 page paper on a topic approved by the instructor. A preliminary draft of the paper will be due at midterm and the final paper will be due during finals week. Research papers will be graded on content, mechanics, control of the Spanish language, and organization.

10% Quizzes. Periodic unannounced quizzes will be given on the textbook assignments.
