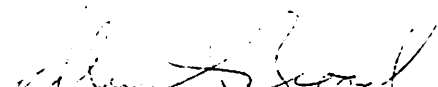

I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION

SP 321 Advanced Spanish Conversation

3c-01-3sh

Prerequisite: SP 221 or equivalent

Extensive practice in oral communication skills. Emphasis is placed on developing fluency in speaking over a wide range of topic areas. Required for all majors and minors.

II. COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. Students will further develop their proficiency in the Spanish language.
2. Students will communicate facts and explain points of view in an uncomplicated fashion.
3. Students will be able to talk, and discuss, in a general way about topics of current public interest, as well as personal interest.
4. Students will be able to understand face-to-face speech in standard Spanish spoken at a normal rate by a native speaker.
5. Students will augment their working vocabulary range related to a variety of topics.
6. Students will deepen their appreciation of the Spanish-speaking people.

410. ADVANCED ORAL EXPRESSION AND COMMUNICATION (3:3:1) Emphasis on achieving practical command of spoken Spanish and the comprehension of native speech. Use of journalistic materials. Prerequisite: SPAN 100 or 110 or 120 or 200 or advanced placement.

SPI 311 ADVANCED SPANISH CONVERSATION.

(11)
Intensive practice in oral Spanish, emphasizing refinement of intonation, and idiomatic expression. Designed to increase and maintain oral fluency in Spanish. May be repeated to a maximum of three credits. Not open to native speakers of Spanish. Lecture, one hour; laboratory, two hours. Prereq: SPI 211 or equivalent.

Washington University

Span 319. Advanced Conversational Spanish

Designed to offer students with advanced skills in Spanish an opportunity to practice and refine their conversational ability. Three class hours per week; focus on a wide variety of topics for discussion; brief oral reports. Prerequisite, Span 215 or 216, or placement by examination.

Advanced Spanish Conversation

This course develops fluency in oral Spanish. Classes are based on discussions of topics of contemporary interest from various media sources.
