b. List of all associated course changes

- 1. Separating out the three education core courses that are now taken before certification
- 2. Replacing HIST 203 U.S. History for Historians with HIST 204 United States History to 1877 and HIST 205 United States History since 1877.
- 3. Replacing the option of taking 6sh in one social science and 3sh in another with a required History minor.
- 4. Adding another 3 hours in college mathematics.

2. Rationale for Changes

- 1. The pre-certification courses are being listed separately to correspond to the new three step process passed by the University Senate in May 2000.
- 2. HIST 204 and 205 are being substituted for HIST 203 to provide a broader background in U.S. History and to fulfill Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) Chapter 4 requirements. The Citizenship Education requirements specify that students should have courses in U.S. and World History. They also state that students should be prepared to teach the PDE Chapter 4 Academic Standards. They include the history, geography, economics and political science standards. The history standards include historical thinking, Pennsylvania History, U.S. History and World History.
- 3. Minoring in History or taking more History courses than any other subject has always been recommended for Geography Social Science Education students, because if these students have to teach another subject besides Geography it will most likely be History. Additionally, the Praxis Specialty Exam (which these students need to pass to get certified) has more history than any other social studies topic. Finally, to keep the number of credits similar to what it is currently, we are eliminating the chance to minor in another Social Science.
- 4. Chapter 354 passed by the PA Legislature has mandated the addition of another 3 hours of college mathematics through a change in the law. This requirement is for all education majors not admitted to Teacher certification before Jan. 23, 2001.

Part III. Implementation.

- 1. Most students are already minoring in history. This change might require extra courses for students who transfer from another university or change majors, but the Praxis Exam content and PDE requirements have forced this change.
- 2. The revisions will not impact teaching loads in Geography.
- 3. These are survey courses so other resources are adequate.
- 4. We do not expect any increases or decreases in enrollment because of these changes.

 The number of students majoring in the geography track is gradually increasing in any case.
