

b. List of All Changes for Regional Planning/ Town Manager Track.

- 1) Addition of RP 333 Trade and Transportation to the Town Manager Track.
- 2) Liberal Studies and Foreign Language numbers are changing to be more accurate.

3) Rationale for the Addition of RP 333 Trade and Transportation to the Town Manager Track.

All town managers must work closely with all levels of highway planning in considering its impact on the region. It was an oversight on our part in the setting up the Town Manager Track to not include RP 333 Trade and Transportation in the list of possible track courses.
