Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

1. Description of Course to be Deleted

GEOS 122 Physical Geology Laboratory

0c-3l-1cr

Corequisite: GEOS 121

Selected problems in rock and mineral identification, topographic and geologic mapping techniques, geologic landforms, and deformation structures. Designed to prepare students for upper-level coursework in geology, physical geography, and anthropology. Includes field trips.

2. Justification/Rationale

Material covered in this course as well as GEOS 121 Physical Geology will be covered in a new course GEOS 201 Foundations of Geology which is being created as part of a department-wide curriculum restructuring.

3. Effects on Existing Courses and Programs

GEOS 122 is currently recommended as a Liberal Studies Natural Science course to students in the Anthropology/Archaeology Track. We will allow these students to take GEOS 201 Foundations of Geology, the introductory course for majors in our new curriculum which will include the laboratory material currently covered in GEOS 122. In addition, these students have (and have always had) the option of taking GEOS 101/102 Dynamic Earth to fulfill this Liberal Studies Natural Science requirement.
