### Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

# 1. Description of Course to be Deleted GEOS 440 Subsurface Geology

2c-31-3cr

An introduction to the geology of petroleum, its origin, migration, entrapment, and production. Lab is designed to provide practical experience in subsurface mapping tech- niques and the use and evaluation of geophysical logging devices. Includes field trips which may occur on weekends.

#### 2. Justification/Rationale

GEOS 440 Subsurface Geology was not a core course that introduced new geological concepts, but rather a course that took concepts students had already learned in Sedimentary Petrology and Stratigraphy and applied them specifically to the kinds of problems faced in the exploration for fossil fuels (coal, oil and gas). This course prepared students very specifically to work in the natural resource industries, particularly those headquartered in the local area such as R&P Coal and S.W. Jack Drilling Company. Since the only faculty member in the department who had expertise in fossil fuel exploration has recently retired, the Geoscience Department no longer has the resources needed to offer this course. In addition, we are in the process of completely revamping our curriculum to emphasize directed problem-solving in every upper-level majors course, so that applied courses such as GEOS 440 will no longer be needed to prepare students for employment. Our new goal is to educate students who can think critically and confidently about their field of expertise and who will therefore be better able to cope with the constantly changing technology of the resource and environmental industries.

## 3. Effects on Existing Courses and Programs

This course was offered as one of several possible upper-level classes that students could take to fulfill their Controlled Elective requirement in the Geology degree track. Current students will be able to fulfill this requirement using existing courses such as Geomorphology, Stratigraphy and Field Geology as well as new upper-level electives such as Soil Geology. Future students will have a different program (described elsewhere in this package of curriculum changes) emphasizing more flexibility of choice and availability of field seminars.
