GS 132 Historical Geology Laboratory is to be deleted.

Justification:

The Geoscience Department has retooled its Historical Geology sequence (GS 131 Historical Geology Lecture, GS 132 Historical Geology Laboratory, and GS 133 Intensive Historical Geology Laboratory) to be a course sequence primarily for Geoscience majors/minors although students from other science departments, science education majors, and majors from Anthropology, Geography, and Regional Planning are welcome. "Old" GS 133 Intensive Historical Geology Lab is replaced by "new" GS 132 Historical Geology Lab. We are deleting the non-majors/minors version of Historical Geology Lab and maintaining the majors/minors version of Historical Geology Lab.

Effects of change:

Geoscience Department majors/minors presently take GS 133 Intensive Historical Geology Lab which has been re-numbered ("new") GS 132. Currently Anthropology majors, Geography/Regional Planning majors, and potential minors are already taking ("old") GS 133. Thus, this deletion will not affect Geoscience majors/minors and other students who are taking an in-depth Historical Geology Lab experience.

Students who did take the ("old") GS 132 Historical Geology Lab for non-majors will now have opportunities to take lectures/labs in GS 101-106 Introduction to Geoscience which includes a semester-long course in geology (GS 101-102 The Dynamic Earth Lecture and Lab). Thus, students who are currently taking ("old") GS 131-132 to partially fulfill their Liberal Studies Science requirements can take any lecture/lab sequence in ("new") GS 101-102, GS 103-104, GS 105-106.
