#### 3. Justification for Revision.

This course change is part of a package of changes including HIST 344, 345, and 346. Because the time span of "Recent United States History" inevitably expands with each passing year, it is necessary from time to time to revise the boundaries of the department's standard chronological courses in American history. In this case, the starting point of Recent United States History is changing from 1929 to 1945 and the two preceding courses are being adjusted appropriately; all three courses are being revised to incorporate new scholarship and to emphasize themes of current interest to the profession. HIST 344 and HI 345 are being given new titles to reflect their new chronological boundaries or emphases. HIST 345's time frame moves from 1900-1929 to 1914 to 1945. Also, as a result of earlier discussions with the university-wide graduate committee, whenever the occasion for revision of a course arises, we are not adding the prerequisite "sophomore standing; completion of HIST 195 (non-majors)" to all undergraduate courses that have a dual-level graduate equivalent.

#### 4. Old Syllabus of Record

A search of departmental files has failed to locate an original syllabus of record; the course was created sometime in the mid-1960s before the University Senate was created and the current approval process established. This means that on the above summary of changes, we can presume that we are making

changes in each of the categories, but we cannot be certain of the exact nature of the changes. For instance, there are many post-1970 books in the bibliography, and these could not possibly have been in the original proposal.
