Examines, where appropriate, the intersection of race and ethnicity, gender and class. Emphasizes the recognition of historical patterns, the interconnectedness of historical events, and the incorporation of various sub-fields in the discipline of history. Successful completion of HIST 196 fulfills the Liberal Studies History requirement. HIST 197 and HIST 198 also fulfill this requirement, and any of these courses may be used interchangeably for D or F repeats

Rationale: History 196/197/198 were created as Liberal Studies replacements for History 195. Since the department will be unable to offer future sections of History 195, the History department will allow students receiving a D or F in History 195 to submit a D/F repeat using History 196/197/198. Since the three courses (196/197/198) are similar courses sharing identical objectives designed to meet the Liberal Studies History requirement, the History department will allow these courses to be used interchangeably for D or F repeats.
