Minor or Track Title	Track – Youth and Families
Narrative Catalog Description:	Focuses on the family unit with an emphasis on theoretical frameworks of family studies; principles related to familial and marital adjustment and coping; and risk and resiliency factors impacting youth and the family dynamics. This track will place emphasis on understanding the various relationships that occur within and around families. Such relationships include, marital relationships, parent-child relationships, peer relationships, extended family relationships, and relationships within alternative family structures.

Investigate social service systems and support strategies for youth and their families. Assess the impact of social and ecological factors on families. Analyze the dynamics that affect family functions and development throughout the life span. Synthesize current research on sexuality and at-risk sexual behaviors impacting youth and families. Apply family theories and approaches to problems affecting families of diverse backgrounds and cultures.
	Rationale for Proposal
Why is this track/minor being proposed?	This track is designed for students interested in pursuing careers focused on working specifically with families and/or young adults. The primary objectives of the Child Development and Family Relations Program are to prepare professionals to administer

	and/or work in programs that entail all aspects of child development and family relations, to teach at the adult level, or to administer human service agencies at federal, state or local levels. This track would serve to extend the students specific knowledge of family interactions and relationship and prepare them for work with these complex
	systems. Currently, the CDFR Program has one course in Adolescent Development and three courses focusing specifically on family dynamics and family issues. However, the program does not specifically aim to prepare students for careers with
	youth and families. This track will strengthen the skills and knowledge in this area and better prepare students to pursue employment focused on working with families and/or
	youth or graduate studies in family therapy, family research, or adolescent development. This track will also enable students to complete the coursework for the Family Life Educator Certificate offered by the National Council for Family Life
	Education.
What role, if any, does it serve the college/university above and beyond the role it serves in the department?	The Youth and Family Track, through the Child Development and Family Relations Program, will be the first program at IUP to focus solely on family issues and marital and family therapy. This track will be an area where IUP faculty and students have the expertise that is needed in the field of child development and family relations.
