#### 2. Summary

The Consumer Services Department proposes to delete the courses that comprised the former College of Human Ecology Requirements substituting courses that better meet the objectives of the major. The number of semester hours required will be unchanged. Specifically:

<u>Delete</u> <u>HE218</u> Child Devel. <u>OR</u> <u>HE224</u> Mar. & Fam. Rel.

FN212 Nutrition OR FN451 Man and Food

Shift to "Major Electives" Segment Add 6sh to the Fashion Merchandising elective requirement to include CS465 Interior Lighting

Rationale for Change

The change in the Fashion Merchandising Major reflects the need to better meet the objectives of the major as evidenced by survey of alums and professionals in the field. The current requirements reflect the former College of Human Ecology requirements.
