Subject: Request to Activate Course Numbers for Swahili

Rational for Change: Prior to the fall semester of 1993, all of the languages taught through the Critical Languages Program were numbered according to the following system: CL 491 for Level I, CL 492 for Level II, CL 493 for Level III and CL 494 for Level IV. The specific language was identified by the section number, and these varied from year to year, depending on the specific languages being offered. If Arabic was not offered in a given year, then Chinese I became CL 491 sec 001, but if Arabic was offered, then Chinese was CL 491 sec 002 because Arabic became sec 001. This system was somewhat confusing and caused all sorts of problems.

Starting in the fall semester of 1993, we switched over to a new system, whereby the first level of the language would be given a number between 100 and 150, the second level between 151 and 200, and that language and level would always carry the same specific number. Therefore, according to this system. Arabic I will always be CL 101, Chinese I will always be CL 102, and so on.

Unfortunately, when this "cutover" was made in 1993, Swahili was not being offered. As the saying goes, "out of sight, out of mind;" when the new numbers were passed out, Swahili did not get one. Last year a faculty member from the History Department and a group of students requested that we offer the language, which hadn't been taught since the new numbering system was implemented. (We had the same experience last year when we offered Hebrew again for the first time in a while, at the request of Religious Studies.) The course numbers CL 491 are still active, but we would like to bring Swahili in line with the other course offerings whereby Swahili I will be CL 115, Level II will be CL 165. Level III will be CL 213 and Level IV will be CL 265.

The Critical Languages Program is not housed in an academic department but answers directly to the Dean's office.
