Prerequisite revision for IFMG230 Introduction to Back-End Business Applications from IFMG-210 to BTED/COSC/IFMG-101.

Part II: Description of Curriculum Change

1. Current Catalog description:

IFMG 230 Introduction to Back-End Business Applications 3c-01-3cr

Prerequisite: IFMG 210

Introduces the back-end business programming language as it applies to business organizations and their applications. Structured back-end business concepts and methods are taught as the student learns how to solve business problems using computers. Involves using files, reports, and tables to produce a variety of outputs utilized in operating and managing business activities.

2.Proposed Change:

IFMG 230 Introduction to Back-End Business Applications Prerequisite: BTED/COSC/IFMG 101

Introduces the back-end business programming language as it applies to business organizations and their applications. Structured back-end business concepts and methods are taught as the student learns how to solve business problems using computers. Involves using files, reports, and tables to produce a variety outputs utilized in operating and managing business activities.

3. Justification/Rationale

Historically IFMG 210 and IFMG 230 used COBOL for teaching programming. Students were introduced to COBOL in IFMG 210 and learned advanced COBOL functionality in IFMG 230. COBOL is language used in legacy environment and MISDS department has moved the focus to modern object oriented languages like JAVA, VB .NET, C++, and C#. The two programming IFMG 210 and IFMG 230 courses introduce students to different languages and cover programming concepts that are self contained within the each course. As such IFMG 210 is no longer needed as a pre-requisite to IFMG 230. In addition relaxing this pre-requisite gives more flexibility to the MISDS department in scheduling its courses. BTED101/COSC 101 is an existing pre-requisite for all MIS courses as per the existing pre-requisite structure.

Course Content and Delivery:
