Part III. Implementation

1. How will the proposed revision affect students already in the existing program?

Answer: Students enrolled in the existing program will substitute OS 411 Microcomputer Support for OS 312 Administrative Office Services.

2. How will the proposed revision affect faculty teaching loads? Have additional faculty been authorized? If you are adding requirements, how will adequate seats be provided?

Answer: This will not affect faculty teaching loads. Faculty who taught OS 312 will be teaching OS 411.

3. Are other resources adequate? (Space, equipment, supplies, travel funds)

Answer: All resources are adequate.

4. Do you expect an increase or decrease in the number of students as a result of these revisions? If so, how will the department adjust?

Answer: Number of students will remain the same.

Additional Questions

1A&B. Is a laboratory experience involved in the proposed new course OS 411 Microcomputer Support? On page 4 of the proposal, in the Evaluation Methods section, there is a statement that 20% of the course grade will be from activities in a "lab environment". Will any part of the 3 s.h. for the course be a lab component? What is the proper designation for the course?

Answer: Although the class meets in a microcomputer lab, the activities in the "lab environment" represent outside homework assignments. Therefore, the proper designation for the course is 3c-01-3sh

2. Is the information to be offered in OS 411 already taught during the three prerequisites?

Answer: Foundation skills are taught in OS 301, OS 313 and OS 400. The information presented in OS 411 builds on these skills. To accommodate students who may have the necessary background and not all the three specific prerequisites, we are willing to add "or permission of instructor".

3. Relative to the Special Resource Requirements: Will the student need to buy other computer supplies? e.g. disks, special paper, other?

Answer: Students will be requested to furnish a computer disk in order to keep a backup copy of assignments.

4A. Is there a discrepancy between the number of prospective students in a section and the number of workstations? Specifically, on page 6 of the proposal the answer to C2 states "Helpdesk software will be required for 20 work stations." On page 8, in the answer to C6: "25 students" in a section of the course.

Answer: Since not all students will be using the software at the same time, the course can accommodate 25 students.

4B. Will the students or the Eberly College of Business buy the Helpdesk software?

Answer: Students will not be required to purchase "helpdesk" software as the Eberly College of Business has a site license for 20 copies.
