Part IV. DESCRIPTION OF CURRICULUM CHANGE

The Music Department proposes to offer participation in the music ensembles listed below for either zero credit or one credit. The one credit offering has been the long-time standard for all ensembles. The proposed change is to offer participation for zero credits in each of the departmental ensembles.

Under the old system students whose credit-load was at maximum would participate in one or more additional ensembles through an informal arrangement with the ensemble director. This meant that there was no documentation of participation either for the student or for the faculty.

Therefore, the proposal to offer a zero-credit section parallel to the one-credit section of each ensemble has these advantages:

- Each student's record will officially reflect the student's ensemble participation.
- Each faculty member's load will reflect the number of students directed in each ensemble.
- 3. For purposes such as insurance for traveling ensembles, the roster of registered students will include all participants.

Note: For grading, the one-credit section will continue to the one-credit section will continue to be offered for A,B,C,D,F grades or for P/F for non-majors; the zero-credit section will be graded on the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory option common to all zero-credit courses.
