2. Summary of Changes: (continued)

c. Rationale for Change:

These changes in the Music Education course program are a minor revision to reflect changes that need to be implemented now. First, the music department is recommending that its students take the EX301 offered by the College of Education. Due to the recent changes in teaching students with disabilities, the music department has no adequate course to address this area.

Second, to meet the guidelines of our accrediting agency, the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) we have prepared a course in Music Technology to replace CM301 for music education majors. The most recent NASM standards state:

E. Technology

Through study and laboratory experience, students should be made familiar with the capabilities of technology as they relate to composition, performance, analysis, teaching, and research.

(NASM Handbook 1997-98, page 79, item VII.E)

It is being offered for 2 sh in an attempt to keep the overall total--which is already 16 credits over the university requirements--at a minimum. The proposal for this course is included in the total program revision packet.

Part III. Implementation:

1. How will the proposed revision affect students already in the existing program?

These changes will have little effect on those students presently in the program. EX301 is already a requirement for teacher certification; the music department is merely making it a part of their program. MU240 will not replace CM301 until these changes are approved. The only effect will be that the students presently in the program will not have the advantage of the material in MU240.

- 2. How will the proposed revision affect faculty teaching loads? Have additional faculty been authorized? If you are adding requirements, how will adequate seats be provided?

 There will be minimal change in faculty loads. MU240 may require an adjustment to the applied teaching loads, but the actual effect is not known at this time due to several related issues and changes in faculty due to retirements. (see page 10, C1)
- 3. Are other resources adequate? (Space, equipment, supplies, travel funds)

 The added courses will not have any affect on present resources. The MU240 class will be taught in the new College of Fine Arts Computer Lab.
- 4. Do you expect an increase or decrease in the number of students as a result of these revision? If so, how will the department adjust?

These changes should have no effect on the number of students in the program.

Based on the recommendations of the Departmental Curriculum Committee, the IUP Department of Music faculty would like to make the following changes to the music education curriculum.

- 1. The committee recommended that for the 1997-98 academic year music education students should take the course EX301, Education of Students with Disabilities and in Inclusive Secondary Classrooms. This decision was based on the fact that the existing course in the Music Department, Music for the Exceptional Student, does not address the latest developments that are involved in teaching students with disabilities. A course will be designed during the next academic year involving Music Education faculty as well as some team teaching from faculty members in the Department of Special Education. It is hoped that such a course will be designed and approved ready for implementation in the 1998-99 academic year.
- 2. Beginning in the Fall 1997, students may elect the course MU337, General Music in the Junior High School. This course is offered for 2 credits and is in addition to existing courses but puts us in compliance with both NASM recommendations as well as that of the independent evaluator in 1988.
- 3. The course MU240, Music Technology will be offered for 2 credits beginning in the Spring Semester, 1998 and will be taken in lieu of CM301. Students requiring this course in their last semester before student teaching in the Fall should still take CM301. Following that, in the Spring 1998 and each semester thereafter, the course MU240 should supplant CM301.
