Catalogue Description Changes: PHILOSOPHY 324

a. Current Catalogue Description:

PHIL 324 - History of Philosophy I

3c-01-3sh

Pre-requisites: None

Western philosophy of pre-Socratic, classical Greek, Roman, and medieval periods. Special attention given to Plato, Aristotle, Augustine, and Aquinas, as well as the philosophic schools.

b. Proposed Catalogue Description:

PHIL 324 - Ancient Philosophy

3c-01-3sh

Pre-requisites: None

Explores the foundations of Western Philosophy through examination of important philosophers of the Ancient period, such as the Pre-Socratic philosophers, Socrates, Plato, and Aristotle. Topics may include the nature of the physical universe, Plato's theory of Forms, the nature of happiness, and the possibility of morality.

c. Rationale for change

The old title does not provide enough information to the students about the nature of the course. The old description does not accurately reflect the way the course is being taught. It suggests equal time treatment between Medieval and Ancient Philosophies. Given the importance of the latter on Western thought it is better to make clear in the description that this is the emphasis of the course.
