Re: proposal to convert the pre-law track into a free-standing minor

Dear UWUCC,

Attached is a copy of a curriculum proposal that would convert the current pre-law track that exists within several departments into a free-standing minor. Because so many signatures were required (18), I concurrently submitted copies of the proposal to the various departments/colleges involved, and have packaged eight separate signature pages along with the proposal and a blank copy of the proposal cover sheet.

During the process of collecting signatures, a question arose over whether the rule that requires that new minors in areas without a major require approval at the system level. I've also included an email written by Dean Camps and endorsed by Provost Samuels that states that the new prelaw minor should proceed under the assumption that we already have pre-law majors (see the attached email on page 14 for a more detailed explanation).

## Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

## 1a. Complete new catalog description for minor:

## Pre-Law Interdisciplinary Minor

Seven courses, including at least one from each of the seven areas:

(no courses with student's major prefix):

Business: ACCT 201, ACCT 202, BLAW 235

Criminology: CRIM 210, 215, 225
Economics: ECON 121, 122, 332
English: ENGL 212, 220, 310
History: HIST 320, 321, 346
Philosophy: PHIL 101, 222, 450
Political Science: PLSC 358, 359, 361

Rationale: The current Pre-Law Tracks in Criminology, Economics, English, History, Philosophy, and Political Science will remain. The Pre-Law Interdisciplinary minor is being introduced so that students in the Eberly College of Business may again take pre-law courses. The Pre-Law Business Tracks could not be reconfigured to keep it under 120 credits and has been inactive. By creating a separate Pre-Law Interdisciplinary Minor it will open up opportunities for students in other majors besides the above seven disciplines to take a pre-law minor in combination with any major in the university.

Subject: Proposed Minor in Pre Law

As I think you know, a collection of departments on campus, including one from the College of Business, one from the College of Health & Human Services, and several from the College of Humanities & Social Sciences have put forward a proposal for a pre-law minor. During this process someone brought up the fact that there's a rule stating that new minors in areas without a major must be approved at the system level. I am certainly aware of the rule but I do not believe it is applicable in this situation. Historically, a dozen different departments on campus have offered the pre-law track as part of a major program. In fact, all six departments in the Eberly College offered a major with a pre-law track until the chancellor implemented the 120 credit hour rule. That rule forced the departments in the Eberly College to cancel each of the pre-law tracks that had been offered for many years. At the present time there are six departments that still offer degrees with a pre-law track. The track connected to a particular discipline is nothing more than a specialized pre-law major. If you get a BA in Criminology, pre-law, it's still a pre-law major. It's just a specialized pre-law major and that's true in every department that offers the track. Given the foregoing, I believe that we should process the new pre-law minor proposal under the assumption that we already have pre-law majors. Surely it should not be necessary to do more than submit this to the vice chancellor for academic and student affairs as an information item. The prelaw minor, when approved, will be a blessing because now any student on campus will be able to combine a pre-law minor with their chosen major. Under the track program, the only people who could even take pre-law were those who adopted a major which contained a pre-law track. You might argue, of course, that the BA in Criminology with a pre-law track is nothing more than a Criminology major with a minor in pre-law. That may be accurate in some sense, but no one could get at these pre-law tracks unless they took the major, which included the pre-law track. Students in Sports Management, Biology, and dozens of other majors will now be able to combine those fields with pre-law coursework.

Thank you for your cooperation in supporting this proposed minor.
