2. c. Rationale for change

An 18 credit minor, with the requirement that at least one course must be at the 300 level or above, will deepen the student's knowledge of political science and therefore be more useful to students in their future careers.

With some qualifications, students are under the catalog requirements existing at the time they entered IUP or at the time they change majors.
