Dr. Pistole,

In regard to the listing of PLSC courses and their disposition for recertification as LSE and GMA courses: (1) PLSC 285 Comparative Government II: Non-Western Political Systems is being revised by its instructor; (2) PLSC 387 Political Systems: Latin America and PLSC 389 International Development Strategies are being revised by their instructor; (3) PLSC 346 Political Sociology is actually Sociology's course, merely cross-listed with PLSC -- we will leave the disposition of the course to Sociology; (4) due to staffing, PLSC 382 Political Systems: Africa has not been taught for years and is unlikely to be taught by PLSC in the future, therefore we will let its certifications slide.

Finally, ITST 281 is also Political Science's course, merely under the International Studies designation. It is presently non-western. This course has not been taught for twenty years and we have no expectation of reviving it. Therefore it will be allowed to lose its GMA certification. John F. Sitton

John, as you know, we are in the final year of our implementation of the new Liberal Studies (LS) Curriculum.
