3. Rationale for Change

This program revision is proposed because of a need to reduce the total number of credit hours for Teacher Education Program(s). This is to facilitate compliance with the SSHE Board of Governors' directive that all programs of study be 120 credit hours. By deleting the 3 credit free elective, 3 credits of Liberal Studies Elective and FDED 102 American Education in Theory and Practice (3 credits) the total credits required are reduced from 129 to 120.

1. The revision of this program will not affect students already in the existing program. The new course of study will begin with students matriculating in Fall 2003.
