3. Rationale for Change

This program revision is proposed because of a need to reduce the total number of credit hours for each Teacher Education Program to facilitate compliance with the SSHE Board of Governors' directive that all programs of study be 120 credit hours. By deleting 3 credits of liberal studies electives and FDED 102 American Education in Theory and Practice (3 credits) the total degree requirement is reduced from 125/126 to 120.

- 1. The revision of this program will not affect students already in the existing program. The new course of study will begin with students matriculating in Fall 2003.
- 2. This program revision will not require additional faculty.
- 3. This program revision does not require additional resources.
- 4. This program revision will not affect the number of students majoring in Early Childhood Education.
