Description of the Curriculum Change

1. A complete catalog description with the new number, title, number of credits, class and lab hour designation, prerequisites, and an appropriately written course description.

ECED 200 Introduction to Early Childhood Education

3c - 01 - 3cr

Prerequisite: Admission to the Early Childhood Education Teacher Preparation program.

Designed to introduce prospective teachers to the historical, sociological, and political aspects of early childhood education. An emphasis is placed on appreciating diversity in the early childhood classroom and on developing keen observation strategies to both heighten understanding of children and evaluate programs that serve them. Five hours of service learning are required.

2. A listing of proposed changes giving the old catalog description and the new catalog description

Catalog Description Change:

Old Catalog Description

An introductory course for prospective teachers of young children. Provides students with the opportunity to gain knowledge of historical, sociological, and political aspects of early childhood education. Emphasizes systematically observing, recording and evaluating children's behavior in classrooms.

New Catalog Description

Designed to introduce prospective teachers to the historical, sociological, and political aspects of early childhood education. An emphasis is placed on appreciating diversity in the early childhood classroom and on developing keen observation strategies to both heighten understanding of children and evaluate programs that serve them. Five hours of service learning are required.

3. Justification/rationale for the change(s)

The change in the catalog description is necessary for three reasons:

- 1. Verifies inclusion of content from EDUC 499
 Multicultural/Multiethnic Education, a course being deleted from the Early Childhood Education course of study
- 2. Addresses requirement of five hours of community service. Twenty hours are required before completion of the program, distributed over three courses. Each course for which service learning is a component is identified in the college catalog.
- 3. Students in this course have been learning to identify quality child care and early education environments but the observation and evaluation of these facilities is a component of the course previously not addressed in the college catalog. This new catalog course description more closely aligns with the NAEYC Teacher Preparation Standards and with current practice and it more clearly defines the current goals of this course.
