III. Justification

This change is required to institutionalize that at least 2 courses will be 300-level courses or higher per PASSHE policy. Almost all of the minors have historically taken SAFE 310 as their "environmental" course in the minor, so we are now requiring it as their environmental course to take. Additional wording has been added reflecting that 3 additional credits will have to be taken in 300-level or higher courses. Since we have some 2cr and 1cr 300-level SAFE courses, "course(s)" is being used in the description rather than just "course."
