II. Description of the Curriculum Change

1. Exact statement of what is to be deleted.

Sociology 380 (Social Research Methods) has been the only research methods course required of the sociology majors and an external review indicated that one course in research methods was not adequate to provide social science students with a sufficient background in social research methods and suggested adding a sequential course. Therefore, in complying with the recommendations of the external reviewer, the department is proposing a sequential research methods course I and II. However, because of how the sequential courses are designed, the availability of course numbers within the university, and the recommendation that the course be a 400 level since it is recommended both courses be taken the senior year, it is necessary for the department to request a course deletion of SOC 380 and we propose adding the courses SOC 460 (in its place) and 461 as the second sequenced methods course in other appropriate paperwork.

2. Justification/Rationale

To date, Sociology 380 has been the only research methods course required of sociology majors. In 1998, Sociology underwent an external review which indicated that the program should have a minimum two course sequence in research methods and that one of these courses should focus on providing social science students with a background in analytical applications that are specific to the discipline. Based on this recommendation, the department is in the process of proposing Sociology 380 be deleted, and in its place SOC 460 be added with a second required methods course, Sociology 461, also added which will focus on analytical methods that are specific to the discipline.

3. How the deletion will affect other courses, programs, and students.

The deletion of SOC 380 and the addition of SOC 460 will not affect existing courses or programs. These courses are for sociology majors only. Therefore, once SOC 380 is deleted and SOC 460 is added, current majors will be required to take SOC 460 and those that declare a sociology major after the sequential methods courses (SOC 460 and SOC 461) are in place will be required to take both courses.


The transition plan for our proposals is for SOC 380 to remain in the AY 2004-2005 catalog with the course deletion passed for and reflected in the AY 2005-2006 catalog. We would like to add SOC 460 and SOC 461 to the catalog beginning AY 2004-2005 which will be required for newly declared majors, but taken in their senior year. Those students currently in the program who need SOC 380 will be able to take SOC 380 while it is still offered AY 2004-2005. Then as new students declare sociology as

their major with SOC 460 and SOC 461 in the AY 2004 – 2005 catalog, we can transition them into the sequenced courses for AY 05-06. Simultaneously, we can transition our existing majors out of the program towards graduation that only need SOC 380 AY 05-06, which will by then, be deleted from the AY 2005 – 2006 catalog and changed to SOC 460. This plan with a timed phase in will provide a transition with ease and opportunity for notification through advising and catalog information for students and advising faculty. Since both SOC 460 and SOC 461 are to be taken in the senior year, this transition plan seems to be the least confusing to current and prospective students and is the most efficient plan in terms of implementing fall/spring sequenced courses without disrupting current students scheduled to take Soc 380 next term and without confusing existing and new students.

III. Letters of Support or Acknowledgement

The deletion of SOC 380 does not affect any other departments therefore, no letters of support or acknowledgement are necessary.
