Rationale for change:

The requirements are designed to prepare students for internships both in terms of academics and applied work experiences. These requirements pinpoint key courses for application in each track and present minimum background, for example sociological theory, for applying sociological knowledge for their applied experiences. For the past several years students have had the most difficulty applying theory to their field experiences. Now that theory is required in their junior year, prior to internship, adding this theory requirement to the list of requirements does not place additional burden but reinforces the importance of this knowledge. Although a "D" letter grade may be considered a passing grade academically, it does not demonstrate adequate competency for direct or applied practice. The current prerequisite "Permission of Internship Coordinator" does not provide the students with sufficient advance knowledge of internship prerequisite expectations through the catalog, therefore, it is in the student's best interests to formalize these requirements and for us to be consistent.
