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3. Rationale for Curriculum Change

SO 459 is being deleted as a Sociology course since it is no longer as relevant to the Sociology curriculum as other remaining courses. AN 321 is being deleted from the Theory and Research controlled electives because it is no longer listed as a course in the undergraduate catalogue.

4. Implementation

1. Students will be minimally affected by this revision. SO 459 has not been taught for many years, and therefore this deletion will not affect the choices available to students in courses.
2. Faculty teaching loads will not be affected, since SO 459 has not been taught since a faculty retirement many years ago.
3. This deletion does not require any additional resources.
4. No change is expected as a result of this revision. There is no need for any adjustments within the department.

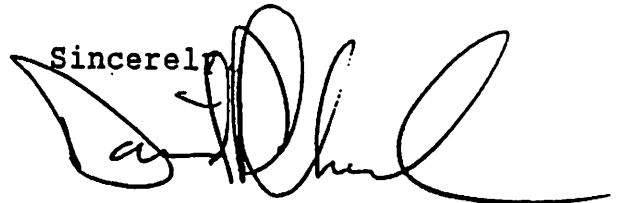
RE: PS 354 - Metropolitan Problems

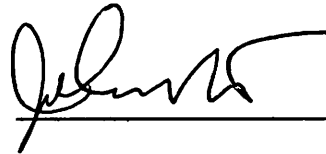
