Rationale for Change

The Department believes that skill in improvisation is a necessary tool for the theater major taking a performance concentration. Performance is highly dependent upon the ability to improvise in the moment, both within the parameters of a scripted production and in terms of creating theater. One of the objectives of the Department is to prepare students to create their own work opportunities in the field, and improvisation is a viable path that leads to such creation. Further, improvisatory skills are useful in myriad presentational, business, and interpersonal situations.

1. How will the proposed revision affect students already in the existing program?

New as well as existing theater majors who are taking the performance area concentration can choose THTR 231: Improvisation and Creativity as one of their concentration electives.

Faculty members Schwartz, Kemp, and Daras are all qualified to teach this course, and thus the department will be able to offer the course once per school year.

While students have expressed great interest in a regular Improvisation course, the Department does not expect a significant change in the number of students on the basis of implementing this course.

The curriculum is evaluated each semester by the department curriculum committee in communication with the department chair. Evaluation criteria includes compliance with learning objectives and student enrollment. Individual courses and instructors within the curriculum are evaluated each semester by faculty peers, and yearly by the department chair. Faculty evaluates courses with regard to organization, promotion of critical thinking, clarity of important concepts, and student involvement.

Student input on curriculum is solicited through monthly meetings with student representatives, as well as through student evaluations on individual courses each semester.

2. Specify the frequency of the evaluations.

Curriculum evaluations are ongoing throughout the school year through faculty meetings and through meetings with student representatives. Faculty meets at least twice per month, and faculty meets with student representatives at least once per month. Also, the program is reviewed by our external accrediting agency, the National Association of Schools of Theater (NAST). Our next reaccreditation review is scheduled for 2017.

The curriculum will be evaluated by the department curriculum committee, faculty peers, the department chair, and students, as well as NAST.
