2. DESCRIPTION AND JUSTIFICATION: BA in Theater -- Performance Track

First and foremost, the offering of this track in the Theater Department curriculum does **not** replace the already offered Liberal Arts BA in Theater currently offered by the department.

The performance track offered here for curriculum implementation is essentially what most of the theater majors in performance are The core BA in Theater consisting of 40 credit already doing. hours is a very broad based degree providing an initial level of understanding across a wide range of specialty areas in the collaborative art form of theater. While ideal for a pure liberal arts degree in its breadth, the minimum requirements of our major curriculum do not explore any area in any depth. As a result, the vast majority of theater majors want to and do take the advanced offered in the various theater disciplines. Performance Track defined in these documents formally recognizes this regular student option. It also provides a needed structure to better advise students in the four year process and to assure that advanced level courses are indeed offered during upperclass years of each of the theater majors.

With the Performance Track, students will be advised to take the introductory level courses required in the BA performance core (TH130, 131 [or 150] 240 and/or 350) in their freshman and sophomore years. In addition, they will be encouraged to take at least one of the Tier I courses during their sophomore year (TH150 [or 131], 250 [or260/270/280/290], 340 or 341). In their junior year in this track, students would be advised to take one of the Tier I courses in each semester. In their senior year, students would be advised to take one of the Tier II courses in each semester. (Please see suggested course progression for Performance Track.)

Part III. IMPLEMENTATION: BA IN THEATER -- PERFORMANCE TRACK

1. The proposed new track will offer structure in terms of both course progression and course offerings over a four year cycle for each theater major. All the courses in this curriculum package have already been taught either under their present course number and/or name or under another course framework such as TH 483 Acting Studio or TH 481 Special Topics. However, both the timing of course offerings and the advisement process largely floated from semester to semester without any consistant structure from course to course and advisor to advisor.

As these courses already exist and have been taught in the last four years, students presently in the program who want to pursue this track will be advised as to whether they can complete the requirements in a timely fashion. If so, they will be allowed to graduate under this track as there is considerable flexibility already worked into the course progressions.

Those students presently accepted into the BFA degree in Performance will be allowed to graduate under the requirements for that degree. As of June 1994 the BFA degree program is on an indefinite "hold".

- 2. There will be no change in faculty teaching loads as a result of this proposed track. No additional faculty will be needed to teach courses for this track. The flexibility of the requirements will lead to few, if any, extra demands for class seats. (Please see "Possible Two-Year Rotation" in Appendix.)
- 3. As these courses have all been previously and repeatedly taught, there are no problems expected with any department resources needed.
- 4. As nearly all previous theater majors with an interest in performance have pursued a course progression similiar to the number of courses in the proposed track, the department does not expect significant changes in the number of theater majors. However, if this curriculum were not instituted, the temporary elimination of the BFA degree option would probably involve a significant decline in the number of theater majors as there would now be no formal recognition of advanced course progressions on a theater major's transcript or degree.

Subject: Curriculum Revisions for the Department of Theater

The attached course proposals submitted by the Department of Theater represent the culmination of a nine month process to rethink and re-structure the courses in the department to better serve our majors and to attract new students to our programs and to meet the curriculum standards of the National Association of Schools of Theatre (NAST).

Last fall the Department of Theater made a decision in conjunction with Dean Heyer (and subsequently Acting Dean Margie Arnett) to seek accreditation with the National Association of Schools of Theater (NAST). Since then the department has been working on a Self-Study Report for NAST. Additionally a consultant came on campus for a two day visit during the Spring 94 semester to look over our program and do a preliminary review of the department.

During this process it was made clear to us that our current B.F.A. program would not meet NAST standards and without further resources we would not be able to make the necessary adjustments. department then decided to suspend the B.F.A. curriculum until such time that more resources would become available. students currently enrolled in the program will be able to finish their program of study, while no new students will be admitted.)

The 40 credit B.A. as it now stands will meet NAST standards with a few minor revisions. Additionally, the Department of Theater felt it would strengthen our program offerings if groups of classes were placed into tracks so prospective students could see a way to specialize in their areas of interest.

The following points need to be understood and applied relating to the future of dance at IUP.

- Future dance faculty at IUP will be housed in the College of Fine Arts and dance programs at IUP will be developed within the Theater Department.
- The College of Fine Arts is authorized to recruit a full-time dance faculty member for the 1994-95 academic year.
- 3. Beginning with the 1993-94 academic year, Professor Lommock, at her request, will move to the College of Fine Arts Theater Department, subject to the approval of the Theater faculty.
- 4. The College of Fine Arts will release dance faculty to the College of Health and Human Services to cover requirements in the Physical Education teacher certification program (25% of one position each semester).
- 5. Dance courses and related rehearsal times will continue to receive priority scheduling in Zink Hall as follows:

On all class days (M-F) from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., academic classes for HPE and TH Departments shall have priority for scheduling of the dance studio, with academic schedules to be negotiated collaboratively between the chairs of HPE and TH.

On class days (M-F) from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., scheduling of academic classes for other departments shall have next priority.

On class days (M-F) after 4:00 p.m. and on weekends or days when classes are not scheduled, priority for the use of the dance studio shall be for activities related to and in support of dance classes and dance performances.

- 6. An office adequate to house two faculty in proximity to the dance studio will be provided the dance faculty.
- 7. The College of Fine Arts will develop a dance curriculum within the theater arts programs. A minor in dance may be developed. For 1993-94 the Introduction to Dance, Fundamentals of Dance, and Dance Production classes will be developed and offered. For 94-95 the rest of the curriculum will be prepared. The minor may be developed and implemented as early as 1995-96.
- 8. All the above provisions are being undertaken to develop a strong dance component integrated into the Theater Arts major. All parties understand that there are no plans to develop a discrete major in dance. This fact will be made clear to new dance faculty.


