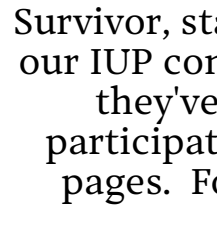

A Reminder from the Counseling Center

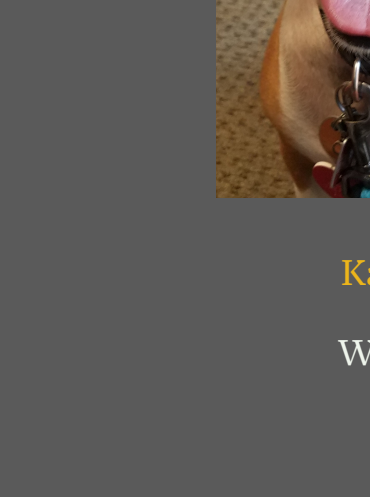

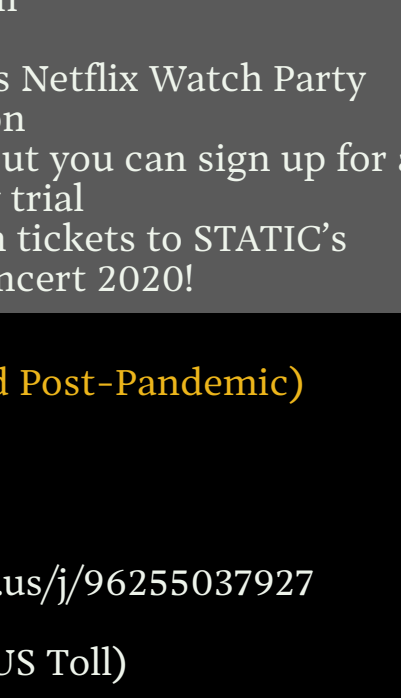
Did you know that we are still seeing students? We are open by appointment only, Monday-Friday, from 8:00 am-4:30 pm.

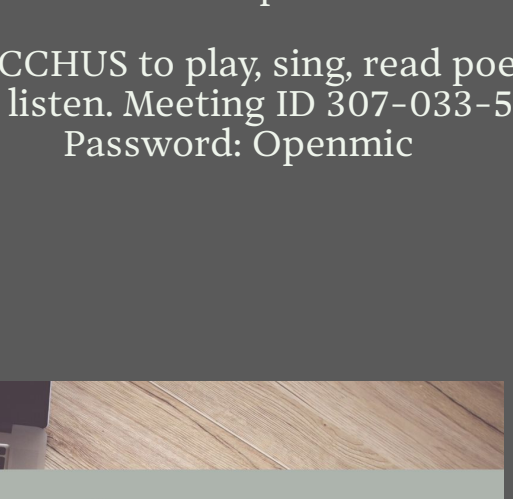

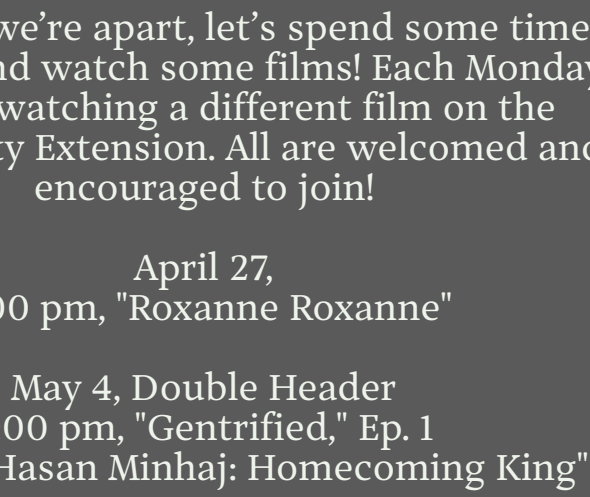

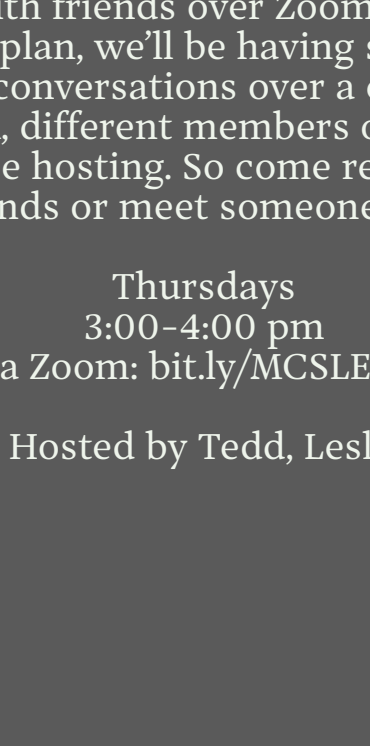
STATIC Event Brainstorming Focus Group 2

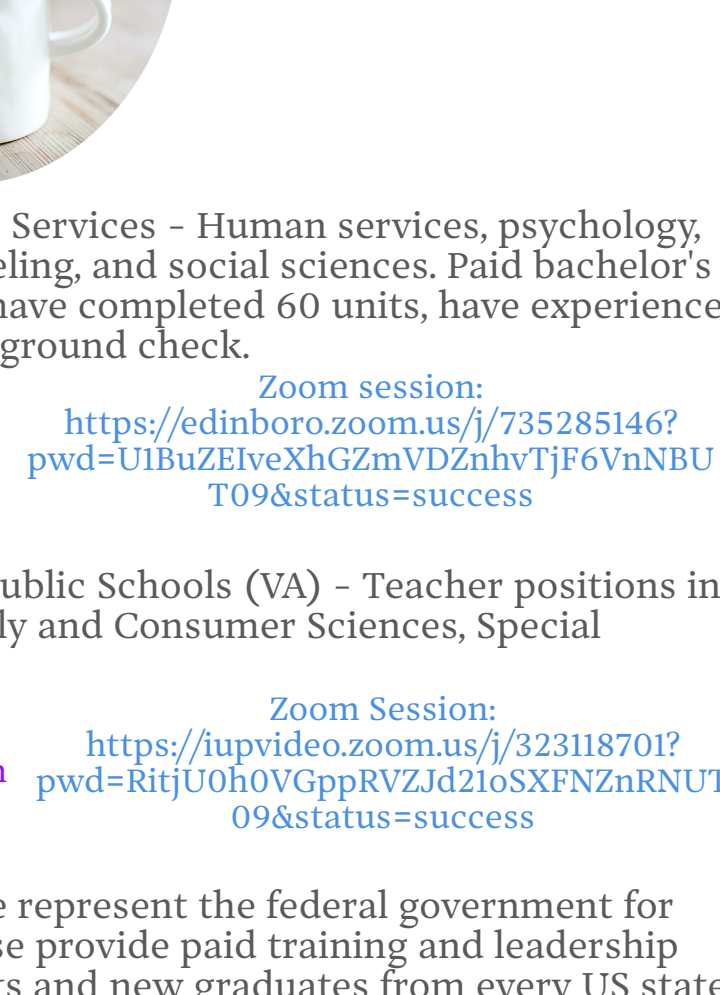

From the Office of Undergraduate Research

We invite IUP undergraduate students to participate in U-SOAR (Undergraduate Summer Opportunity for Applying Research; formerly known as RESS)—IUP's summer program to engage undergraduates in original research and scholarship. The application portal is up and running, and we hope you'll join us. Student participants will each receive an approximately \$2000 monetary award to work online with a faculty mentor this summer!

Specifics:

1. The deadline for applications has been extended to Friday, May 1st at 4:30 pm. You can apply below.
2. Students must be able to complete their project without using a lab, without doing field-work, and with no face-to-face interactions with their faculty mentor or research subjects. So, what kind of projects meet these guidelines?

Here are some examples:

1. Analyzing a previously collected data set
2. Creating new art
3. Doing a literature review for a future paper
4. Writing a survey paper
5. Composing a new musical piece
6. Innovating new k-12 curriculum
7. Conducting a virtual survey or interviews for a study
8. Doing a purely theoretical project (maybe involving mathematics, developing new software, doing historical research, etc.)
9. Conducting market research or doing a feasibility analysis for new product development

There are so many varying options, so be creative!

The program will consist of five virtual events over the summer and a poster session during the second week of the fall semester. Students will be required to present in that poster session. The other events will consist of three virtual Zoom meetings where current or former participants in the program will share their research. There will also be a virtual resume/cv workshop to help students fine-tune their resumes for that next step. Lastly, there will be a virtual poster workshop to help students create and prepare a poster for the poster session event.

What is the U-SOAR award? The award will be solely monetary. We are hoping to award \$2,000 to each student participant, although award amounts may vary.
