Using Advising to Make the Case for Tenure and Promotion



This issue of the Advisor Advocate shares highlights from an August 2022 NACADA article by IUP Associate Professor Kalani Palmer. "<u>Using Advising to Make the Case for Tenure and Promotion</u>" discusses how faculty members can and should talk about advising in addition to the areas of teaching, scholarship and service. She argues advising performance is not typically reviewed or assessed in the tenure and promotion process but that it should be since quality advising is shown to improve retention, persistence, and graduation rates, and ignoring faculty contributions in this area is an injustice.

"Essentially high quality advising requires time. Faculty that put in the effort should highlight the work. Encouraging and advocating for faculty to highlight their advising work may help normalize the inclusion of advising efforts in tenure and promotion materials" (Palmer, 2022).
