1. What is the mission of your podcast? What topics will you cover in your podcast?

- 3. What tools do you need to buy to start your podcast?
- 4. Which type of editing software is right for you?
- 5. What type of podcasting platform appeals to you?
- 6. Where will you record your podcast?
- 7. What will you do during recording to cut down on noise?
- 8. Will your podcast have music added? If so, where will you find the music? Original music is a great way to go!
- 9. If you are working with one other person or a team, who will do the editing of the podcast? Who will finalize the podcast to the "master" copy and publish the podcast?
- 10. How will you promote the podcast? Twitter? Facebook? Does your college or university have resources that you can use?
- 11. Would you like to invite others to watch you record your podcast? If so, where would this take place?
- 12. Would you like to host a panel discussion for an episode of your podcast? If so, think of topic ideas and guests.
- 13. Would sponsors be an option for your podcast? If so, reach out to them and see if they would be interested in advertising on your podcast. This could mean money for a scholarship or funding for a project.
- 14. How can you make sure you are reaching your target audience? Your platform probably has a place for comments, but it is good to have other options as well.

Maybe a separate email for your podcast or your own website, Twitter account, Facebook page, etc. This is also a great way to garner topic ideas and feedback.
