**Fee Analysis: Brief Summary** 

# **Tuition Technology Fee**

Beginning in fall 2025, rate-setting authority for the technology tuition fee was delegated to each university's council of trustees. According to PASSHE Procedure/Standard 2011-02-A: "If a university's council of trustees does not approve a recommended rate, the technology tuition fee rate for that university will change at a rate equal to the percentage change in tuition approved by the Board of Governors for the respective year."

The purposes of the technology tuition fee are: (1) to acquire, install, and maintain up-to-date and emerging technologies to enhance student-learning outcomes; (2) to provide equitable access to technology resources; and (3) to ensure, ultimately, that System graduates are competitive in the technologically sophisticated workplace. All hardware, software, databases, and other capital equipment procured with these revenues are to support student learning experiences.

Rising technology costs coupled with declining enrollment and deferred maintenance needs has put strain on the technology budget and negatively impacted critical technology services and infrastructure. A proposed increase of approximately 10 percent for FY2026-27 and another 10 percent for FY 2027-28 is being proposed. The additional funds resulting from the proposed fee increase will be used to support multimedia classrooms, academic wireless, and PC replacements for faculty and students and allow for future technology enhancements.

# <u>Consolidation and Simplification of Fees – Services Fee</u>

After careful analysis and review, a cross-university workgroup recommends that IUP modify the current fee structure for undergraduate and graduate students. The current fee structure contains both flat and per-credit fees, with eight mandatory fees appearing on a student's bill. The eight mandatory fees are as follows:

- Student Service Fee
- 2. Wellness Fee
- 3. Registration Fee
- 4. I-Card Fee
- 5. Transportation Fee
- 6. Technology Tuition Fee
- 7. Activity Fee
- 8. Instructional Fee

The workgroup is recommending this fee structure be consolidated from eight mandatory fees to four mandatory fees. The first five fees listed above (i.e., Student Service, Wellness, Registration, I-Card, and Transportation Fees) would be consolidated into one fee. The Technology Tuition, Activity, and Instructional Fees would remain as individual fees. This will simplify the bill for students and families and reduce the processing time required by IUP staff. There is not a significant increase to revenue nor cost of attendance as this change was calculated using a near break-even approach.

### **Meal Plan Fees**

The Meal Plan Fees support the IUP Dining Auxiliary fund. With careful consideration for our students in mind, IUP had not increased dining rates for 6 plus years, even though our costs have been increasing each year. Last year, the workgroup recommended a proposal, which was approved and placed IUP's meal plan rates at approximately 5 percent above the current system average. The workgroup felt this recommendation would position IUP's projected revenue to be better aligned with the increased expenses that had been absorbed over the past 6 financial years when there were no rate increases and help to close the budget deficit. The workgroup also felt this was the most student-centered approach, keeping in mind that we felt this was the maximum increase that our students could absorb at one time, knowing that we further increases would be necessary.

The workgroup is now proposing an additional 7% increase to meal plan fees, effective fall 2026 and another 5% increase effective fall 2027. It is also proposed to incorporate a new unlimited meal plan based on student demand.

# **Act 120 Tuition**

The Criminal Justice Training Center (CJTC) currently charges a tuition fee of \$6,000 per cadet. All external costs and equipment, with the exception of uniforms, are provided to students through the collection of this fee. It is being proposed that this fee be increased to \$6,500 to support necessary and overdue technology advancements, replacement vehicles, increased staffing costs, and overall rising costs associated with firearms (shooting range, holsters, targets, hearing and eye protection, etc.).

# **SSP School Security Personnel Class**

The School Security Personnel Program is an online training that is a requirement for any school police officer, school resource officer, or security guard. The current fee is assessed at \$395 per person. It is being proposed to increase this to \$495 to support increased staffing costs, technology advancements, and replacement vehicles.

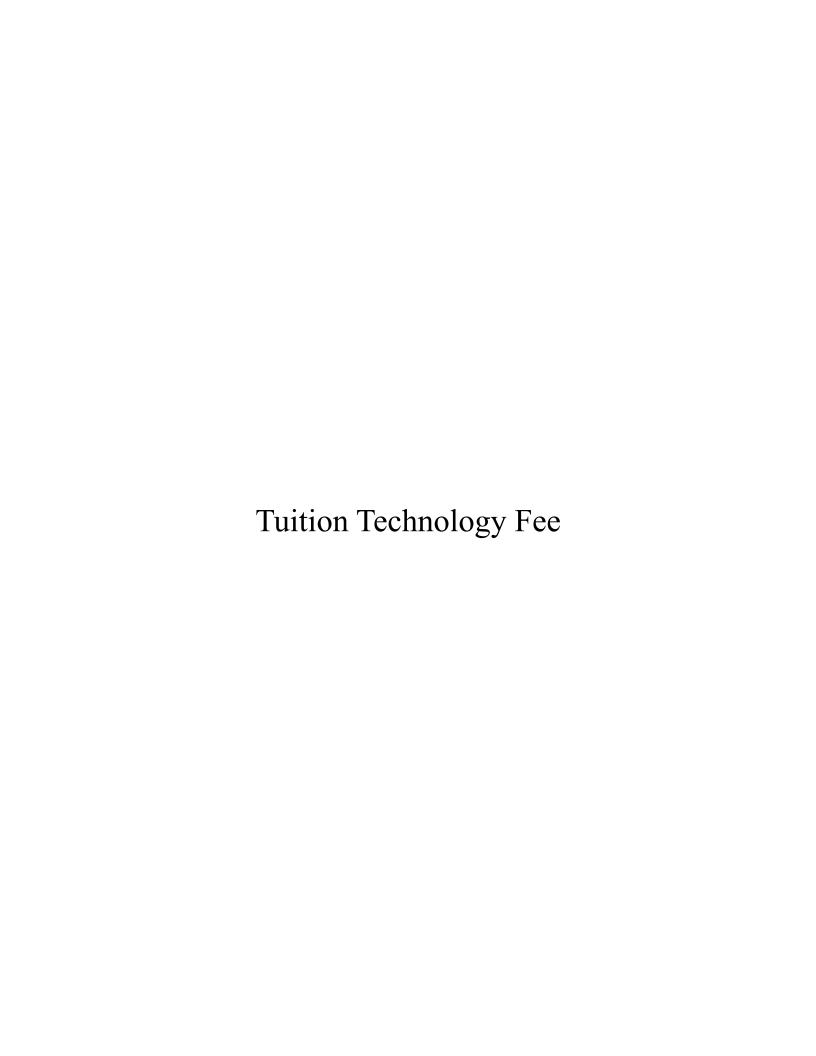

# **Technology Tuition Fee Proposal Justification**

# **Problem Statement:**

# **Declining Enrollment Impact**

Decreasing student enrollment reduces the revenue generated from the Technology Fee, straining the budget.

# **Rising Technology Costs**

Costs for maintaining and upgrading technology infrastructure continue to increase, adding pressure to the budget.

# **Budget Imbalance Effects**

The combination of reduced budgets and increased costs have impacted critical technology services and infrastructure.

# **Proposal for Fee Increase**

An increase in the Technology Fee aims to restore budgets and balance technology funding with technology needs.

### **Phased Fee Increase**

The proposal suggests an approximate 10% phased increase in Technology Fee over FY27 and FY28 to generate additional revenue.

### **Revenue Projections**

Expected estimated increase is ~\$400K in FY27 and ~\$400K in FY28 from the fee increase.

# **Fund Allocation**

Additional funds will support multimedia classrooms, academic wireless, and PC replacements for faculty and students.

# **Summary of Recommendation to Consolidate Mandatory Fees**

**Overview:** The Tuition Model and Pricing Workgroup, which is currently co-chaired by the Vice President for Student Affairs and the Strategic Advisor to the President for Student Success, was charged with reviewing and analyzing the cost of attendance for IUP students. The workgroup has already completed its review of undergraduate, in-state tuition, which became effective fall 2022, and the undergraduate, out-of-state, domestic tuition which was approved in December 2022 and was implemented in fall 2023. In addition, the workgroup has also completed a review and a recommendation for international, undergraduate tuition, which was also implemented along with a change to the cost of attendance for our dual enrolled students. As the workgroup has assessed the various tuition structures, the workgroup continues to consider the university's financial status and balance the impact of the recommendation on both students and university revenues, keeping the student's interest at the core of any changes to the tuition model as a primary goal.

While at this point, the consolidation of fees is being brought forward, we are continuing our work with the overall cost of attendance at IUP and continuing to thoroughly review student fees. Graduate tuition is currently being reviewed, and this work will continue over the next several months, in anticipation of a recommendation being made for implementation for the fall 2026 semester.

A summary of the fee consolidation recommendation follows. If approved, it is proposed that the change take effect for the fall 2026 semester.

### **Summary of Recommendation:**

- a. The following section lists six current fee categories that are charged to undergraduate and graduate students, and how the proposed fee consolidation would be applied.
  - **1. Current Undergraduate:** Student Service Fee (\$17 per credit), Wellness Fee (\$20 per credit), Registration Fee (flat fee of \$32 per semester), I-Card Fee (flat fee of \$10 per semester), and Transportation Fee (flat fee of \$25 per semester).

Proposed Undergraduate: Consolidated into one \$42 per credit "Undergraduate Services Fee".

**2. Current Undergraduate Distance Education:** Student Service Fee (\$17 per credit), Registration Fee (flat fee of \$32 per semester), and I-Card Fee (flat fee of \$10 per semester).

Proposed Undergraduate Distance Education: Consolidated into one \$21 per credit "Undergraduate Services Fee".

**3. Current Undergraduate Intersession (Winter and Summer):** Student Service Fee (\$17 per credit), and Registration Fee (flat fee of \$32 per semester).

Proposed Undergraduate Intersession: Consolidated into one \$20 per credit "Undergraduate Services Fee".

**4. Current Graduate:** Student Service Fee (\$14 per credit), Wellness Fee (\$20 per credit), Registration Fee (flat fee of \$32 per semester), I-Card Fee (flat fee of \$10 per semester), and Transportation Fee (flat fee of \$25 per semester).

Proposed Graduate: Consolidated into one \$45 per credit "Graduate Services Fee" for both Master's and Doctoral students.

**5. Current Graduate Distance Education:** Student Service Fee (\$14 per credit), Registration Fee (flat fee of \$32 per semester), and I-Card Fee (flat fee of \$10 per semester).

Proposed Graduate Distance Education: Consolidated into one \$21 per credit "Graduate Services Fee".

**6. Current Graduate Intersession (Winter and Summer):** Student Service Fee (\$14 per credit), and Registration Fee (flat fee of \$32 per semester).

Proposed Graduate Intersession: Consolidated into one \$20 per credit "Graduate Services Fee".

b. These recommendations, if approved, would simplify the student's bill and our overall fee structure. There is not a significant impact to revenue resulting from these changes as they were calculated using a near break-even approach. See Appendix A. An overall impact to the student's cost of attendance, assuming other fees remain flat, can be found in Appendix B.

### **Meal Plan Fees – Summary of Recommendation**

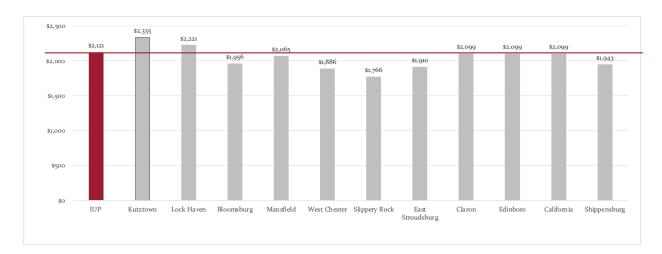
A proposed increase of 7 percent for FY2026-27 is being brought forward along with a proposed increase of 5 percent for FY2027-28. In addition to the proposed increases to the existing meal plan rates, a new unlimited meal plan is being proposed, for the following reasons.

- An anticipated increase in CPI (currently projected to be around 4 percent for next year)
- Continued efforts to grow the program and fund an additional retail concept that is yet to be determined.
- An unlimited plan in response to student feedback and demand
- With careful consideration for our students in mind, IUP had not increased dining rates for 6 plus years, even though our costs have been increasing each year. This resulted in the need to position IUP's projected revenue to be better aligned with the increased expenses that had been absorbed over the past 6 financial years. Knowing our student's could not absorb this at one time, we felt moderate increases each year would be the most student-centered approach.

### Expenses Summary - Act 120

Classes for the Criminal Justice Training Center (CJTC) at the Indiana Campus begin in January and June of each year. It is difficult to predict a number for classes until approximately 1 week prior to classes beginning. It is very dependent on interest, sponsorships, and how many applicants actually pass the Physical Training standards to enter the academy. We also have an academy at our CNX (CNX Resources in Washington County) satellite location. That class runs from May-March of the following year (45 weeks). Since we just moved to that location it has started with absolute minimum number of students.

Roughly we can budget for 60 cadets per year- which gives us an estimated revenue budget of \$360,000 per year. This fluctuates based upon actual numbers.

We have rolled all external costs of the student into our tuition costs, with the exception of uniforms. Current tuition is \$6,000 per cadet, and uniform costs are between \$400-\$450. The academy provides all of the equipment that a student will need while in the academy.

### Tuition covers:

Salaries and benefits of current staff which includes a full-time director, program coordinator and admin support.

Instructor Salaries-\$36,000 per class X 3 classes per year- \$108,000

Equipment- duty belts- Fully equipped- \$200 per student- These are reused, and new equipment is only purchased when things need replaced.

Books-\$105 per cadet -Increased from \$45

Range Fees- \$3500 per year- No previous fees

Ammunition-\$15,000 per year -Increased from \$10,000

Classroom upgrades- All desks, AV equipment, Mats, TV's, laptops, Etc.

Misc.-Uniforms, travel, administrative supplies, Etc.

### Expenses summary School Security Personnel (SSP)

Our School Security Personnel Program is an online training that is a requirement for any School Police Officer, School Resource Officer, or Security Guard. It is derived from Act 67 of 2019.

Currently our cost for the program is \$395 per person. The program is catching on all over the state and most months I have to run a double cohort requiring 2 instructors. I would like to increase the cost of the class to \$495 per person. This additional revenue would assist with the proposed items below:

- \*Adjunct Instructors have not had a raise in the past 8 years since I have worked at the academy. They currently make \$30.00 per hour. I would like to increase this to \$35 per hour.
- \*The academy has an aging fleet of vehicles and is in need of newer vehicles. Several of our vehicles will be taken out of service this year and given to surplus since they are too rusty to be repaired.
- \*Technology advancements are needed. A driving simulator and additional mats are needed in order to promote the best possible program.
- \*We have also added the cost of accreditation without hiring any additional staff or increasing our current budget. We pay yearly for the computer program and also have to attend conferences and host our evaluators. This is an additional \$5000 per year.
